Formality of Ballot Papers Guide

INTRODUCTION

Ballot papers for the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council will only be included in the count of votes where the ballot paper has satisfied formality requirements as established by the *Electoral Act 1907* (The Act). Ballot papers sent to postal voters will have the word postal included in their title.

For Legislative Assembly ballot papers relevant sections of the Act include sections 98C, 139, 140 and 140A.

For Legislative Council ballot papers relevant sections of the Act include 98D, 98E, 146E, 146EA, 146EB and 146EC.

Understanding these formality requirements can be confusing. This publication is to assist electoral officials, candidates, scrutineers and electors better understand and apply the requirements during their respective roles.

Ballot paper formality principles

When assessing ballot paper formality, the following principles apply:

1. Favour the Franchise

In the situation where the voter has tried to submit a formal vote, (i.e. the ballot paper is not blank or defaced) questions of formality should wherever possible be resolved in the voter's favour.

2. Only have regard to what is written on the ballot paper

The intention of the voter must be quite clear. Do not assume what the voter was trying to do if it is not clear – only consider what is written on the ballot paper.

3. The ballot paper should be considered as a whole

By considering the number in each square as one in a series, not as an isolated number, a poorly formed number MAY be recognisable as the one missing from the series.

Incorrect district and postal/non postal ballot papers

If a ballot paper for another district is found mixed in with ballot papers for the district being counted it is considered informal.

Similarly, if a postal ballot paper is found with non-postal ballot papers, or conversely a non-postal ballot paper is found with postal ballot papers it is considered informal.

Authentic ballot paper

Ballot papers are printed on official paper carrying a watermark image or other security features.

However, on rare occasions ballot papers may be produced locally by a Presiding Officer due to operational necessity and are not necessarily informal. Ballot papers so produced (e.g. by photocopying an unused ballot paper) must be initialled by the Presiding Officer or Issuing Officer on the back.

Where the Phone Assisted Voting (PAV) system is being used, completed Legislative Assembly vote records (ballot papers) are printed after close of poll at the Processing Centre on special security paper.

Determining formality

The scrutiny and count of all ballot papers is undertaken in a prescribed manner. After the close of the poll the officer conducting the count (Assistant Returning Officer) will review the ballot papers as to their formality and either reject or admit the ballot paper to the count.

Scrutineers have a right to challenge the admission or rejection of any ballot paper at the scrutiny. The grounds for a challenge may be the formality or informality of the ballot paper.

A ballot paper so challenged is to be endorsed on the back as “admitted” or “rejected” and initialled by the officer conducting the count. If rejected, the officer is to affix a sticker to the back indicating the reason for rejection.

Subsequently, determining the formality or otherwise of any ballot paper is the responsibility of the Returning Officer, either during a fresh scrutiny or at any time before the declaration of the poll, and may only be varied thereafter by a Court of Disputed Returns.

Legislative Assembly

1. Formality of Legislative Assembly ballot papers

1.1 Informal ballot papers

Ballot papers are informal when:

- totally blank;
- the number '1' appears against two or more names;
- two or more names have been left unnumbered;
- marked in any way by which the voter can be identified, e.g. the voter may have signed the ballot paper and the signature identifies the voter; or
- are otherwise marked inconsistent with the requirements of the *Act* and the voter's intention remains unclear.

Alterations to the numbers do not make a ballot paper informal provided the voter's intention is clear.

If an elector initials their ballot paper in such a way that does not identify the elector, it does not make the ballot paper informal. Conversely, if the initials do identify the name of the elector that the ballot paper must be considered informal.

1.2 Two Candidate ballot paper

In the unlikely event that a Legislative Assembly ballot paper comprises only two candidates, a further series of sample formal and informal ballot paper images will be distributed

1.3 Challenge by Scrutineers

If a ballot paper is challenged by a scrutineer, under section 138 of the *Act*, the ballot paper is endorsed on the back as 'admitted' or 'rejected' and initialled by the officer conducting the count.

Subsequently, determining the formality or otherwise of any ballot paper is the responsibility of the Returning Officer and thereafter may only be varied by a Court of Disputed Returns.

Examples of Legislative Assembly ballot papers and how their formality is assessed are illustrated on the following pages.

2. FORMALITY OF LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL BALLOT PAPERS

2.1 Marking Legislative Council Ballot Papers

Voters are given two options. They may indicate their vote:

- **Above-the-Line (ATL):** Marking the number 1 in the square above the party or group of their first choice. They may also make more choices, if they want to, in order of their preference starting from the number 2; or
- **Below-the-Line (BTL):** Marking the number 1 to 20 in consecutive numbers in the squares to the left of the candidate's names. Further numbers may be marked starting from the number 21.

On election night the indicative Legislative Council Count consists of a count of above-the-line votes with a single 1 marked only.

2.2 Informal Ballot Papers

Legislative Council ballot papers are informal when:

- totally blank;
- marked in any way by which the voter can be identified, e.g. the voter may have signed the ballot paper and the signature identifies the voter (an initial that does not identify the elector does not make the ballot paper informal); or are marked inconsistent with the requirements of the *Act* and the voter's intention remains unclear.

2.2.1 Informal Votes - ATL

Legislative Council ballot papers are informal when one or more first preference marks have been placed above-the-line.

For example:

- the number 1 appears more than once;
- the number 1 in combination with a cross (x) or a tick (✓) appears;
- a tick (✓) and a cross (x) appear;
- a tick (✓) appears more than once; or
- a cross (x) appears more than once.

Note: The number 1 by itself, a tick (✓) by itself or a cross (x) by itself is formal.

2.2.2 Informal Preference Votes (BTL)

Legislative Council preference ballot papers are informal if marked below-the-line and:

- the number 1 does not appear against any candidate's name (a tick or cross is not acceptable unless the order of preferences is clear);
- any number is repeated against two or more candidates' names; or
- Less than 20 squares are numbered.

Note: Alterations to the numbers do not make a ballot paper informal providing the voter's intention is clear, additionally, an electors' initials that do not identify the elector does not make the ballot paper informal.

2.3 Ballot papers marked both above and below-the-line

Where a voter has marked both the above-the-line and the below-the-line preferential options, the ballot paper is treated as follows:

- when both are marked correctly (the ballot paper is formal), count the below-the-line candidate preference votes;
- when only one is formal, count the formal selection (i.e. if the preferences above-the-line are entered correctly, but incorrectly below-the-line, the preferences above-the-line are counted and conversely if the preferences below-the-line are entered correctly, but incorrectly above-the-line, the preferences below-the-line are counted);
- when both are informal, the ballot paper is informal.

2.4 Challenges by Scrutineers

If a ballot paper is challenged by a scrutineer, under section 138 of the *Act*, the ballot paper is endorsed on the back as 'admitted' or 'rejected' and initialled by the Assistant Returning Officer.

Subsequently, determining the formality or otherwise of any ballot paper is the responsibility of the Returning Officer and thereafter may only be varied by a Court of Disputed Returns.

Examples of Legislative Council ballot papers and how their formality is assessed is illustrated on the following pages.

2.5 Double sided ballot paper

If it is necessary to print a double-sided Legislative Council ballot paper, the second side is considered to be a continuum of the first side.
